
Author's Latest Teaches Kids Confidence & Focus

t's the "Most Wonderful Time of the Year" — or so the classic Staples Lcommercial tells us! Back-to-School season is in full swing, and while some kids (and parents) are elated, others... not so much. The beginning of the school year may bring excitement and nervousness simultaneously, and it can be tricky for parents and teachers to help children both manage their feelings and focus on their schoolwork. Enter children's book author and Westfield resident, Rosanne L. Kurstedt, Ph.D. As an educator with over 20 years of experience, Kurstedt understands the challenges that the start of the school year can bring. Her latest picture book, Karate Kid (Running Press Kids, 2019), teaches children mindfulness, focus and inner strength, all explained through the skill of karate.

Karate Kid allows readers to explore

the traditional practice of Shotokan karate, a martial art that not only teaches physical methods, but is rooted in character development as well. Kurstedt explains, "(The book) highlights some of the core elements of karate — respect, focus and confidence." Kurstedt herself is well versed in the martial art of tae kwon do, for which she holds a brown belt. She has since taken a break from her tae kwon do practice, however during her research for Karate Kid, Kurstedt worked with a sensei in the Shotokan style of karate to make sure she nailed every detail. The book's prose blends delightfully with the fun illustrations of a goat "kid" performing specific moves, including the proper terminology for each position or stance, as well as breathing techniques. Kurstedt feels this book is important because, "It introduces kids to karate in an engaging and accessible way." One of the most surprising things Kurstedt discovered when writing *Karate Kid* was that she really misses practicing tae kwon do. Some of her hobbies have included skiing and photography, but...Kurstedt may add tae kwon do back to the list in the near future!

Throughout everything she does, Kurstedt's love of reading, writing, teaching and connection to "story" shines through. As the Associate Director of READ East Harlem/Hunter College, Adjunct Professor at the Hunter College School of Education, founder of the nonprofit The Author Experience, Assistant Regional Advisor of the New Jersey Chapter for the Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators (SCBWI) and children's book author, Kurstedt realizes her passion for literacy and education every day. "I've always

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been a writer," she notes. "I've kept journals all of my life - even my college entrance essays were excerpts from my journals." In addition to Karate Kid, Kurstedt has authored and co-authored numerous professional development books; and during a time living in Hong Kong, she also helped establish the Hong Kong Academy International School, and was their Director of Curriculum. After Kurstedt returned to New Jersey, another project she developed was The Author Experience - a nonprofit organization dedicated to building "a lasting culture of literacy".
